Her latest book is *Swan: Poems and Prose Poems*.

Call for Submissions

The Reach of Song 2011

For the 2011 edition of *The Reach of Song*, Editor Sandy Hokanson will accept submissions beginning January 1, 2011, through Tuesday, February 16, 2011, from members in good standing of the Georgia Poetry Society. The Society encourages all current members to submit works for *The Reach of Song 2011*, although membership does not guarantee inclusion.

In addition to member poems, the collection will contain the winning poems of the 2010 youth and adult contests, as well as the recipients of The Awards for Excellence among member poems. The anthology will be available at the July 2011 quarterly GPS meeting.

Please submit **two poems** for consideration. Include two carefully typed copies of each work, one copy with your name and address. Entries

- (1) must be 40 lines or fewer,
- (2) must not have been previously published in The Reach of Song, and
- (3) must not have won a cash prize in any state-wide poetry competition.

Submissions may be on any subject and may follow any form. Two nonmember judges will rank the works. Those receiving highest marks will qualify for First-, Second-, and Third-Place Awards of Excellence. The poems receiving these awards will be published in *The Reach of Song 2011* and the award recipients will receive free copies of the anthology. No more than one poem per poet will be included in the Member Section. Each poet will receive a proof of the poem chosen for publication, with a request for a prompt response.

To reduce typing, email submissions are encouraged and must be received by February 16, 2011. Send all online submissions to hokansonGA@comcast.net.

We regret to inform all GPS members of death of one of our poetry enthusiasts. Dorothy Janis Williamson Worth passed peacefully on December 23, 2010. She was a long time member of Atlanta Writers Club, Southeastern Writers Association, and Georgia Poetry Society and served as president of each. Also, she was active in The Village Writers.

From age ten, she was a poet and winner of awards, nationally, internationally, and locally, including the 1996 Dickson award of the Georgia Poetry Society for her chapbook *Desert Places*. She was widely published, and she frequently taught at writers' conferences.

Her careers included reporter, legal secretary, and then teacher of languages, French, Spanish, and English. She retired

from Georgia State University in 1997. She is survived by husband Gene Worth, son John Worth, his wife Concha, and grandsons Christopher and Henry Worth.

Memorial service was at Oak Grove United Methodist Church on Tuesday, December 28, 2010 at 11am with her family receiving guests at 10am.
