Featured Poet: Sandy Hokanson

At the July meeting, we are pleased to feature one of our own poets, Sandy Hokanson, who recently published her first book of poems, *Snow on Stone*.



Sandy started writing poetry in her teens; was involved in journalism in high school and college; has written children's curriculum for David C. Cook Publishing Co. and children's puppet shows and drama for a number of churches in the past 35 years. She has been in numerous writing groups, including a poetry workshop in Rockport, Massachusetts for seven years. She and her husband, Dale, lived in Topsfield, Massachusetts



Kennesaw State University, located at 1000 Chastain Road, is in Cobb Co.., 20 minutes north of Atlanta on I-75, one exit north of Town Center Mall.

We asked poet Alice Friman, our featured poet at the meeting, to judge the Lanier poems. We will reveal the winner at the July meeting and have that poet read the winning entry.

The prize was donated by Bob Lynn. It is a \$50 volume of *Poetry Speaks Expanded*, featuring recordings of 47 of the greatest poets reading their best poems, including James Joyce, Sylvia Plath, e.e. cummings, Ezra Pound, Robert Browning, Walt Whitman, and William Butler Yeats.

Roseanna Almaee reports that The Albany Writers' Guild is being revitalized after many years of little to no action. The intention of the group will be to form a creative teaching and learning community of writers from all genres working together to learn about and improve their craft. We will be holding an organizational meeting in August.

Emery Campbell has had three of his writings chosen for publication in the 2011 anthology *Shout Them from the Mountain Tops II: Georgia Poems and Stories*, a book sponsored by the GCTE (Georgia Council of Teachers of English). They are "Saved by the Flare" and "Memorial Day," prose stories; and "Curses! Foiled Again," a poem. The book encompasses works by writers and artists 18 and over presently living in Georgia. Emery also was awarded a third honorable mention in category number 45 of the 2011 NFSPS contest series.

Dr. **Jim Green**, who teaches business at Georgia Southern in Statesboro, is a new member of GPS. He has an MFA in Creative Writing from Antioch-Los Angeles and plans in retirement to spend more time writing poetry. This summer he and his wife are back in Ireland on the western coast at their cottage near Shannon. Dr. Green will serve on the GPS membership committee for Southeast Georgia.

Alabama's **Jerri Hardesty** impressed a band of 20 at the June 20 Johns Creek Poetry Group meeting with the quality of her performance and her writing. Jerri is a ten-time haiku champion and goes head-to-head in poetry slams across the South. She encouraged poets to hone their presentations and look audiences in the eyes to give their poetry maximum impact

Sandy Hokanson recently published her first book of poems, *Snow on Stone*. She says, "If you like rock walls and the dramatic changes of the seasons in New England, or poems about family relationships, you may be interested in my book. Other poems, "Old Plank road Pottery" and "The Gate," received honorable mention awards in the 1st annual Byron Herbert Reece Society Poetry contest. "On a Day, Still" will appear in the fall 2011 issue of *Chrysalis Reader*. "Breaching" will appear in the GPS anthology, *The Reach of Song* 2011. A recent public presentation was "Sing Me the Creation: Poems for the Earth, Poems for Coming Home," with musical accompaniment, April 23, at Promenade of the Arts, Mt. City, Ga.

Poet **Karen Paul Holmes** has recent acceptances by *Poetry East, Referential Magazine*, the *And Love* anthology by Jacar Press, and the *American Society: What Poets See* anthology by FutureCycle Press.

GPS Vice President and poet **Jill Jennings** was featured in a poetry reading and talk on June 18 at The Little Shop of Arts and Antiques, Lilburn, GA.

McCaysville Poet **Robert Kimsey** will read his mountain poetry to the Johns Creek Poetry Group on Saturday, August 27, 10:15 a.m. to 12 noon at Northeast Regional Library. Active in the Georgia Poetry Society, he guides the Blue Ridge Poets and Writers and is on the planning board of the Blue Ridge Writers Conference. He is also a long-time member of the Kentucky Poetry Society. This event will also include an open mic and critiquing of your poems.

Robert S. King has recent acceptances of his poems in *Indigo Rising, Foundling Review, The Reach of Song* (GPS anthology), and *Thoughtsmith*. He has also completed his third full-length collection now seeking a publisher.

Berthena Lankford may have endured a poetry experience worthy of a poem. On April 29 she and a friend drove from Blairsville to Macon for the GPS meeting, only to find their hotel rooms unavilable due to hotel overbooking. Searches for lodging proved futile because of an FFA convention that had Macon motels stuffed with teenagers. Berthena decided to drive towards Atlanta and ended up back home in Blairsville at 3 a.m. on Saturday morning, where she slept through the GPS doings at the Lanier Cottage in Downtown Macon. Bob Lynn made three poetry appearances July 7-9 in South Georgia. He presented his poetry to The Rotary Clubs of Thomasville and Eastman and participated in the first Independent Authors Book Fair in downtown Thomasville. He also conferred with area poets who agreed to help GPS find more prospective members in South Georgia. These included Julie Rucker, senior high English teacher in Tifton, Georgia, and Johnny McMoy, Planning Director for Middle Georgia College. Barry Marks, with the help of publicist Hunter Bell, gave three June readings in Birmingham and scheduled at least two for later this summer in support of his book, *Possible Crocodiles* (www.brickroadpoetrypress.com). Barry's advice: "Getting someone to make arrangements for readings is worth a little money or asking a friend for a favor. Bookstores and coffeehouses react better to a 'publicist' than the author."

Martha Phillips, local author and poet, moderated a session of poetry reading for the Osher Lifelong Learning Institute at the University of Georgia, July 15, 1:30 - 3:30. The reading included works of Pat Adams, Linda Moore, Martha Phillips and Gay Williford. Their poems and limericks have won awards from the Georgia Poetry Society, Southeastern Writers Association and the Georgia Federation of Women's

Clubs. Martha and Gay live in Athens. Pat and Linda reside in Oconee County. As members of the Poet Pourri group formed several years ago by Gay Williford, the poets meet regularly to read and share poetry, prose, essays and limericks.

Kit Schmeiser's poem, "Winter Trees," received 2nd place in the Joyce Kilmer 75th Anniversary Celebration poetry contest. The Stecoah Valley Cultural Arts Center in Robbinsville sponsored the contest, and judges included one of Joyce Kilmer's granddaughters. Over 115 Adult and Professional entries were received. Winning poems will be posted at the Center throughout July.
