

Natasha Trethewey - Special Speaker

U.S. Poet Laureate and Pulitzer Prize winning poet is our special guest speaker.



Natasha Trethewey is the 19th United States Poet Laureate (2012-2013). In his citation, Librarian of Congress James Billington wrote "Her poems dig beneath the surface of history—personal or communal, from childhood or from a century ago—to explore the human struggles that we all face." She is the author of *Thrall* (2012), *Native Guard* (Houghton Mifflin), for which she won the 2007 Pulitzer Prize, *Bellocq's Ophelia* (Graywolf, 2002), which was named a Notable Book for 2003 by the American Library Association, and *Domestic Work* (Graywolf, 2000). She is also the author of *Beyond Katrina: A Meditation on the Mississippi Gulf Coast* (University of

Georgia Press). A memoir is forthcoming in 2013.

Her first collection of poetry, *Domestic Work* (2000), was selected by Rita Dove as the winner of the inaugural Cave Canem Poetry Prize for the best first book by an African American poet and won both the 2001 Mississippi Institute of Arts and Letters Book Prize and the 2001 Lillian Smith Award for Poetry.

Trethewey is the recipient of fellowships from the Guggenheim Foundation, the Rockefeller Foundation Bellagio Study Center, the National Endowment for the Arts, and the Bunting Fellowship Program of the Radcliffe Institute for Advanced Study at Harvard. Her poems have appeared in such journals and anthologies as *American Poetry Review*, *Callaloo*, *Kenyon Review*, *The Southern Review*, *New England Review*, *Gettysburg Review*, and several volumes of *The Best American Poetry*. At Emory University she is Robert W. Woodruff Professor of English and Creative Writing. In addition to being United States Poet Laureate, she is the State Poet Laureate of Mississippi, from 2012-2016.

Gregory Fraser & Chad Davidson - Morning Workshop



Gregory Fraser and Chad Davidson, UWG Professors of literature and creative writing, will be conducting a morning workshop entitled, "The Dangerous Because: Avoiding the Trap of Logical Conclusions in Poetry".

Gregory Fraser is the author of three poetry collections, *Strange Pietà*, *Answering the Ruins*, and *Designed for Flight*. His poetry has appeared in journals including *The Paris Review*, *The Southern Review*, and *The Gettysburg Review*, and he is the recipient of a grant from the National Endowment for the Arts.

Chad Davidson is the author of *Consolation Miracle, The Last Predicta*, and *From the Fire Hills*. His poems have been published in *Ploughshares, Virginia Quarterly Review*, and *AGNI*, among many others, and he is also a translator of contemporary Italian poetry and prose.

Davidson and Fraser have also coauthored two textbooks: *Analyze Anything: A Guide to Critical Reading and Writing* (Continuum, 2009) and *Writing Poetry: Creative and Critical Approaches* (Palgrave Macmillan, 2009). They are both professors of literature and creative writing at the University of West Georgia near Atlanta.

DIRECTIONS AND MAP

To the University of West Georgia, 1601 Maple St., Carrollton, Georgia 30118 Enter the West Entrance, Building Z-6 is the first large building on your left. We meet on the lower level.

From Atlanta

Travel I-20 West to Villa Rica/UWG Exit 24 and turn left (west) onto Hwy. 61. Travel about 12 miles to Hwy. 166 (Carrollton South Bypass) and turn left onto the 166 Bypass where Grace Lutheran Church will be on the right. (Other landmarks to watch for before you reach the light at Hwy. 166 include Richard Haney Ford and Ryan's Steakhouse on the right and McDonald's, Zaxby's and Longhorn Steak House on the left.) On the 166 Bypass, travel to the 6th traffic light. A CVS will be on the corner. At that light, turn right onto Maple Street (also Hwy. 166). WUG will be on the left about 6/10 of a mile along Maple Street.

From Birmingham

Travel I-20 East to Bremen/UWG Exit 11 (Old exit 3), turn right (South) and follow Hwy. 27 South into Carrollton, turn right onto Maple Street (Hwy. 166). UWG will be on the right approximately 2 miles.

From Rome

Travel Hwy. 27 South into Carrollton, turn right onto Maple Street (Hwy. 166). UWG will be on the right approximately 2 miles.

From Columbus

Travel I-185 North to Newnan, take Hwy. Alt. 27 North to Carrollton. Turn left (south) onto By-Pass 166. At the 4th traffic light, turn right onto Maple Street (Hwy. 166) and UWG will be on the left approximately 6/10 of a mile.

At our January 19th meeting in Kennesaw, we highlighted past presidents and presented those still living with a Gift Certificate to Barnes and Noble bookstore. Here is the summary that was read.

1979-1981 Edward Davin Vickers, a Charter Member, deceased in 1991.

1981-1983 Dr. Bettie M. Sellers, a Charter Member, lives in Young Harris, GA but is not well.

1983-1985 Dorothy Williamson Worth, deceased.

1985-1987 Dr. E. Jerome Zeller, also a Charter Member, deceased.

1987-1988 Calvin Atwood, deceased.

1988-1990 Dr. Frank McKemie, deceased.

1990-1992 Ethelene Dyer Jones, a Charter Member, was an English teacher and library/media specialist. During her term, Poetry In The Schools was started. She led the campaign to host the National Federation of State Poetry Societies annual meeting, which came to fruition several years later. She is a charter member of the Byron Herbert Reece Society which has secured the poet's farm and turned it into a tourist venue. She won 1st place for the Evelyn Cole Peters Award from the Daughters of the American Revolution for her poem, *Stitches of Appalachian Heritage*. Her books include: *The Singing in the Wood, Mother and Child Reunion, Through Sunlight and Shadow*, and *Meditations of the Moment*.

1992-1993 Georgia T. Henry-Pearson didn't respond to our letter so we have no further information.

1993-1995 B.I. Garland, deceased as of 2003.

1995-1997 Margery V. Carlson, deceased.

1997-1999 Emily Blake Vail was a college instructor, poet/writer and choir member. It was during her term that GPS began planning to host the National Federation Poetry Convention. She and Marge

Carlson had done much of the planning for the event, when Marge died suddenly, and John Ottley had to take over. Besides poetry, she has written mysteries for all ages. She has won numerous prizes including the Virginia Poetry Society, the Chicago Poetry Society sonnet Contest, and a National League of American Pen Women first prize at both the local and state levels. Her two books of poetry are *Poems...This Fragile Earth* and *Poems From Time Past*.

1999-2001 Herbert W. Denmark, was in the Army, stationed at Ft. Gillam and worked for the army after retirement running a military electronics warehouse. It was during his term that the National Federation meeting actually took place in June. A web site was started by Emery Campbell, a film was made of on of the quarterly meetings held at the Atlanta Women's Club and shown on a cable channel and the membership reached 200 for the first time. He has published several chapbooks and one hardback, *In Metaphysical Splendor*. Herbert was unable to be with us today but is an active member.

2001-2003 John K. Ottley, Jr. had dual careers in association management and the Army Reserve and had just sold Midwest Poetry Review when he became President. He worked to make meetings more geographically convenient to members living outside of Atlanta and reached out to professors to sponsor the meetings to save meeting room fees. He has self-published two books, and a third was published by Main Street Rag Press. He is currently branching out into historical prose. He reads two newspapers every day as well as books about history and biography.

2003-2004 Rosemary Mauldin is a Registered Nurse and case manager. During her Presidency, she worked to personally contact former members to encourage them to renew their membership. She encouraged meeting in more colleges, promoted Poetry in the Schools including volunteering with Easter Seals Headstart program. She has been published in the poetry Guilds book *A Celebration of Poets*, showcase edition and the *International Poets Society's Anthology* for two years.

2004-2006 Dr. Steven Shields has had careers as a radio announcer, a professor of Communication at the University of Wisconsin and is now an adjunct instructor in Communication and Media Studies in Gainesville at the University of North Georgia. During his presidency, poetry contests were consolidated from monthly to annual competitions and many contests were renamed. The anthology was rescued from extinction and reinvented using outside judges to select the member poems. Steven has published two books of poetry, *Daimonion Sonata* and *Valentines for Many People* and won the Helen Schaible national sonnet competition, in 2007.

2007-2009 Ron W. Self is an attorney and instructor in the College of Business at Columbus State University. He was one of three 2011 Under 100 winners, is a 2-time Founders Award winner and has won 3 first places in the National Federation of Poetry Societies contests. During his term, the beginning and end of Presidential terms were moved from July to January, so he served two and a half years instead of two. One highlight was a joint meeting with North Carolina Poetry Society, held at the home of Carl Sandburg. And another was a meeting at the Coca Cola Space Science Center in Columbus, GA with horse and carriage rides to his house for lunch.

2009-2010 Keith Badowski lives in Phenix City, AL and is Assistant to the Pastor at Epworth United

Methodist Church and Editor and Co-Founder of Brick Road Poetry Press. Their motto is, "For poetry that will entertain, amuse and edify (not drain, confuse, and mystify.)" Keith is known for bringing his antique typewriter to meetings and writing poems for people on the spot for a donation to GPS. He has a Chapbook called *My Wife Warned Me and I Did It Anyway*. Keith was unable to be with us today.

2011 Robert S. King was a retired Software Engineer and Publisher, and has recently stepped down as Director of FutureCycle Press to devote all his time to his own writing. Robert set up regional committees to conduct activities in their areas, and revamped the GPS website into a Content Management System. He has been the featured poet in several magazines and has been nominated for both the Pushcart Prize and Best of Net Award. He has five collections of poetry: When Stars Fall Down as Snow, Dream of the Electric Eel, The Traveler's Tale, The Gravedigger's Roots, The Hunted River and One Man's Profit coming this February. Due to illness, Robert was unable to complete his term.

2011 Steven Shields was interim president following Robert S. King's resignation, serving from October through January when our current president, Sandy Hokanson, was installed.
