

Linda Taylor - Morning Workshop Leader

Linda Taylor has published over 75 poems, in *The Kenyon Review, The Massachusetts Review, Black Warrior Review, The Ohio Review, The Georgia Review, Tar River Poetry, The (Ohio State) Journal, Permafrost, Nimrod, Poetry Northwest* and other journals. She has won prizes for poetry at the *Nassau Review* and *The Comstock*



Review. Her work in the *Indiana Review* was nominated for a Pushcart Prize. In 2008 and 2012 her book manuscript was a semi-finalist in the University of Wisconsin Press poetry first book competition, and a finalist in the White Pine Press first book competition. She has published scholarly work on Emily Dickinson and on Henry James. She currently teaches literature and creative writing at Oglethorpe University in Atlanta. She advocates for the environment in Georgia and spends time on the Oregon coast. Recently she traveled to Tanzania to research the landscape, life and work of archaeologist Mary Leakey.

Morning Workshop Plans/Instructions from Dr. Taylor:

"For the Morning Workshop, members wanting to have their poems critiqued aloud, by me and the group, should **send their poems to Sandy by email by June 28th (hokansonGA@comcast.net**). Send no more than two or three pages per member. Sandy will send these poems to me. Besides other examples from well-known poets, our poems will be the main texts used to discuss how to make our poems better. We won't be able to critique all of them in the 75 minutes, so I will select representative ones, and those that have some of the same issues."

Afternoon Small Critique Groups: In the morning, sign up with one of 12 different GPS Members who will lead small critique groups (3-5 persons). Bring 5 copies of a poem. Come with an open mind! 
Cost: \$14.00 per person (The GPS is buying the breakfast and subsidizing \$3.00 per person to keep the lunch costs low.)

Traveling north on I-85

From downtown Atlanta, take Exit 94 and turn RIGHT onto Chamblee-Tucker Road. At the second traffic light, turn RIGHT onto Mercer University Drive; go approx. one block, then turn right into main campus entrance. At stop sign, turn right – parking on your left (North Parking Lot) is closest parking lot for Trustees Dining Room.

Traveling south on I-85

From outside the perimeter, take Exit 94 and turn LEFT onto Chamblee-Tucker Road. At the third traffic light, turn RIGHT onto Mercer University Drive; go approx. one block, then turn right into main campus entrance. At stop sign, turn right – parking on your left (North Parking Lot) is closest parking lot for Trustees Dining Room.

Traveling on I-285 North/West

Take Exit 34 and turn LEFT onto Chamblee-Tucker Road. Proceed for 1.2 miles, than turn LEFT onto Mercer University Drive; go approx. one block, then turn right into main campus entrance. At stop sign, turn right – parking on your left (North Parking Lot) is closest parking lot for Trustees Dining Room.

Traveling on I-285 East

Take the Chamblee-Tucker Road Exit, turn RIGHT onto Chamblee-Tucker Road. Proceed for 1.2 miles, than turn LEFT onto Mercer University Drive; go approx. one block, then turn right into main campus entrance. Betty Sellers Dies: At the time we were preparing to Honor Past Presidents, we heard that Bettie Sellers, GPS president 1981-83, was unwell. We have since found out that she died on May 17, 2013 in Hayesville, NC at the age of 87. Her home was in Young Harris, GA.

John Ottley, Jr. says she was an amazingly talented teacher and poet. She taught English for 31 years, chaired the humanities division of Young Harris College, was Georgia Poet Laureate under Gov. Zell Miller, was a noted Byron Herbert Reece scholar, and in fact, won an Emmy for a film on Reece. She published several volumes of poetry, received the Poet of the Year Award from American Pen Women and the Governor's Award in Humanities. Donations to GPS may be made in her honor.
