

# **Gregory Fraser and Chad Davidson -**Workshop Co-Leaders

**Gregory Fraser** is the author of three poetry collections, Strange Pietà, Answering the Ruins, and Designed for Flight. His poetry has appeared in journals including The Paris Review, The Southern Review, and The Gettysburg Review, and he is the recipient of a grant from the National Endowment for the Arts.



**Chad Davidson** is the author of Consolation Miracle, The Last Predicta, and From the Fire Hills. His poems have been published in *Ploughshares*, Virginia Quarterly Review, and AGNI, among many others, and he is also a translator of contemporary Italian poetry and prose. Davidson and Fraser have also coauthored two textbooks: Analyze Anything: A Guide to Critical Reading and Writing (Continuum, 2009) and Writing Poetry: Creative and Critical Approaches (Palgrave Macmillan, 2009).



They are both professors of literature and creative writing at the University of West Georgia in Carrollton, Georgia.



## **Directions to Classic Center, Athens**

#### From Atlanta:

The Classic Center is made up of several buildings. The Foundry Building is a historic building on Foundry Street just behind the other buildings on N.Thomas Street. It has the name of the building in large letters on the outside and it is near the parking deck. You can also park behind the Foundry Building and walk in the back door. The Cypress Room is just inside the back door. A professional musician came up from Atlanta to spend the day with the children and Mildred before school was out.

Currently Mildred has resumed guiding a poetry group at a local church. This is her eighth year to enjoy this activity. Both Ann Gillespie and Duanne Kaiser are active in the class. #### **Call for Submissions**

## The Reach of Song 2014

For the 2014 edition of The Reach of Song, Editor Karen Pickell will accept submissions beginning January 1, 2014, through February 21, 2014, from members in good standing of the Georgia Poetry Society. The Society encourages all current members to submit works for The Reach of Song 2014, although membership does not guarantee inclusion. In addition to member poems, the collection will contain the winning poems of the 2014 youth and adult contests, as well as the recipients of The Awards for Excellence among member poems. The anthology will be available at the July 2014 quarterly GPS meeting.

Please submit two poems for consideration. Include two carefully typed copies of each work, with only one copy including your name, mailing address, phone number, and email address. Entries

- (1) must be 40 lines or fewer,
- (2) must not have been previously published in The Reach of Song, and (3) must not have won a cash prize in any state-wide poetry competition.

Submissions may be on any subject and may follow any form. Two nonmember judges will rank the works. Those receiving highest marks will qualify for First-, Second-, and Third-Place Awards for Excellence. The poems receiving these awards will be published in The Reach of Song 2014 and the award recipients will receive free copies of the anthology. No more than one poem per poet will be included in the Member Section. Each poet will be asked to promptly review a proof of his/her chosen poem prior to the anthology's publication.

Email submissions to <u>karenpickell@gmail.com</u> are preferred, to reduce retyping, and must be received by February 21, 2014. Please include "ROS 2014" and your last name in the subject line, and send your poems in a Microsoft Word document attached to the email.

Artwork will only be accepted for consideration January 1–31, 2014. Images received outside of this timeframe will not be considered. Images submitted must be appropriate for young children, as The Reach of Song is distributed to schools and libraries. The Reach of Song editor and assistant editor will decide on the winning cover art entry, and the winner will be notified by February 28, 2014. If no suitable entry is received, the editors reserve the right to select cover art from an alternative source.
