

Ronald Boggs, 1942—2017

Ron Boggs was the author of three works of prose and approximately twenty books of poetry. His avocation and passion was as a poet and writer. In his words, "It is the edge of soul's calling." He was also a student of American history, leading him to advanced degrees from two universities in American history and culture, culminating in a doctoral dissertation on the culture of liberty versus power in American History as well as its larger form in human history in the conflict between liberty and tyranny. He also studied and expounded in his prose works on Jungian psychology and the art and practice of Zen. These influences show up in his poetry. He was quite involved in the Georgia Poetry Society, leading the Johns Creek Poetry group and expanding their community involvement in recent years, as well as serving as Vice President of the GPS during 2017.



Ron also excelled in the field of finance; for many years he worked for large, major mutual fund companies and insurance companies dealing with advanced planning issues such as charitable planning, annuity and retirement planning, and established his own financial planning firm. In later years, he worked as a teacher and mentor for college students and retirees, helping them succeed in that field as well. He was a man of diverse interests, a lifelong student and teacher. We will miss his enthusiasm and spirit.
