

# January 26, 2019 Quarterly Meeting W.C. Bradley Company, Columbus, GA

Nick Norwood's poems have appeared in *The Paris Review, Oxford American, Shenandoah,* US Poet Laureate Ted Kooser's *American Life in Poetry, The Writer's Almanac with Garrison Keillor, Pushcart Prize XLII* and elsewhere. His three full volumes include Hollis Summers Prize winner *Gravel and Hawk.* He has collaborated with artist Mike McFalls on a permanently installed public art piece, "powerhouse," on the Chattahoochee River Walk in Columbus, Georgia; with artist and master printer Erika Adams on the fine press books *Wrestle* (2007) and *Text* 



(2016); with art photographer Chuck Hemard on his book *The Pines*, and with composer Matthew McCabe and reader James Ogburn on the recording "Firewood." Norwood teaches creative writing and is Director of the Carson McCullers Center for Writers and Musicians in Columbus, Georgia, and Nyack, New York. His fourth full volume of poetry, *Eagle & Phenix*, is due out in 2019.

Michelle Castleberry is a writer and social worker living in northeast Georgia. Her first book, *Dissecting the Angel and Other Poems*, was a finalist for the Georgia Author of the Year in Poetry, 2013. Her work, including two Pushcart nominations, can be found in publications like *The Chattahoochee Review, Still: The Journal,* and *The Atlanta Journal.* She is currently a Makery Fellow with the Hindman Settlement School in Kentucky.

### Us: Our Univocal Pome

During the October 20, 2018 GPS meeting, poet Sandra Meek led a compressed workshop on how to construct univocal poems, ones that restrict their content to words incorporating the same vowel and no others. Meek asked participants to vote for which vowel they wanted to use in compiling such a poem, but O and U ended up more or less tied after the initial vote. That divide showed up in a single line contributed by someone who seems to have employed the second vote's runner-up vowel in protest. Other contributors interpreted as permission Meek's discussing the univocal process as one to prompt creativity during blocked or dry spells and, so, treated the single-vowel rule as a mere suggestion.

GPS hopes to preserve any similar such group efforts and likewise present them via the newsletter.

### **Entries:**

- 1. must be 40 lines or fewer.
- 2. must not have been previously published in *The Reach of Song*.
- 3. must not have won a cash prize in any state-wide poetry competition.
- 4. may be on any subject and may follow any form.
- 5. are limited to two poems per member.

Membership does not guarantee inclusion in the anthology. Two nonmember judges will rank the Member Section submissions. Those poems receiving highest marks will qualify for First-, Second-, and Third-Place Awards for Excellence and will be included in *The Reach of Song 2019*. Each placed award winner will receive a free copy of the anthology. Additional highly ranked poems will be included in the book as Honorable Mentions or Selected Member Poems. No more than one poem per poet will be included in the Member Section.
